Saturday 18 October

Sofia Locomotive Depot visit Retro Tram Tour, Part 1, including depot visit

Overnight: Sofia

As well as locomotives used by BDZ on passenger trains Sofia Locomotive Depot is home to some out of use diesel and steam locomotives, including a pair of Austrian built class 04 diesel-hydraulics.

Sofia operates trams of both standard and narrow (1009 mm) gauge. The larger part of the network is narrow gauge, which is where our tram tour will operate.

The tour price includes - Airport Transfer; Sofia Locomotive Depot visit; dinner in the hotel; and overnight in 3-star hotel.

The Retro Tram Tour is offered as an optional extra at additional cost.

Sunday 19 October

Charter train - Sofia - Septemvri (ex BR Class 86 and Class 87) Service train No: 16107 - Septemvri 16:28 - Velingrad South 18:13h

Overnight: Velingrad

The narrow gauge railway from Septemvri - Dobrinishte was dieselised with Henschel diesel-hydraulic locomotives built in 1965. We have requested these Henschel veterans are used on the Service Trains in the itinerary.

The tour price includes – Charter train described above; ticket for the above service train; breakfast; box lunch; dinner in the hotel; and overnight in 3-star hotel.

Monday 20 October

bus transfer Velingrad - Septemvri

Visit to locomotive depot, and Wagon Factory in Septemvri

Charter train - Septemvri - Plovdiv - Dimitrovgrad

(ex BR Class 86 and Class 87)

Charter train - Dimitrovgrad - Kaloyanovets (ex BR Class 86)

Visit to Kaloyanovets Depot

Charter train - Kaloyanovets - Stara Zagora (ex BR Class 86)

Overnight: Stara Zagora

The Wagon Factory in Septemvri has its own locomotives on two gauges including the unique narrow gauge 91-40.

Kaloyanovets Depot is home to more than a dozen steam locomotives, which once formed the Bulgarian strategic reserve. Riga built EMUs and various other items of rolling stock have been reported at Kaloyanovets.

The tour price includes – Wagon Factory in Septemvri; bus transfer as noted above; Charter trains described above; Visits to Kaloyanovets and Plovdiv depots; breakfast; box lunch; dinner in the hotel; and overnight in 3-star hotel.

Tuesday 21 October

Charter train - Stara Zagora - Ljubenovo (ex BR Class 86)

Visit to Maritza Iztok Complex (including charter train using Maritza Iztok locomotive) Charter train - Ljubenovo – Plovdiv (ex BR Class 86) calling at Stara Zagora to drop off those continuing to the "Steam Tour" q.v. Service train No: 5B 1614 - Plovdiv 18:03– Sofia 21:00 Overnight: Sofia

Maritsa Iztok operates more than 100 kms of railway and is Bulgaria's largest industrial railway by a substantial margin. There is an interchange with BDZ at Ljubenovo. Most of the Maritsa Iztok network is electrified at 1,500vDC and is operated by East German EL2 electric locomotives. The railway also operates diesel locomotives of classes 06, 52 and 55.

The tour price includes – Stara Zagora depot visit; charter trains described above; Visit to Maritza Iztok Complex; ticket for the above service train; breakfast; box lunch;

farewell dinner in local tavern; and overnight in 3-star hotel.

Wednesday 22 October

Retro Tram Tour, Part 2

Visit to the Transport University (Todor Kableshkov)

The Transport University is home to Czech built electric locomotive 42 072-9, which enthusiasts will recognise as a sister of CSD's "Laminatkas". Narrow gauge steam locomotive 615-76 is also plinthed at the University.

Maritza Iztok Complex



One of the numerous East German-built EL2 electric locomotives working a lignite train in the Maritza Iztok complex.

A highlight of the Classic Traction Tour will be the visit on Tuesday 21 October to the Maritza Iztok Complex. Our Charter train will be brought to Ljubenovo by the ex BR Class 86 where a Maritza Iztok locomotive will take over.

Most of the Maritsa Iztok network is electrified at 1,500vDC and is operated by East German EL2 electric locomotives. The railway also operates diesel locomotives of classes 06, 52 and 55.

We have been promised the journey in the complex with our Charter train pulled by a local locomotive will be about 12km in total. The group will be able to get off the train at one of the stations, where the locomotive and wagon depots will be visited on foot.

The Maritza Iztok company was originally established in 1951. The present company was formed in 1993. Three coal mines are in operation, as follows –

- Troyanovo-1 (opened 1952)
- Troyanovo-North at Kovachevo (opened 1964)
- Troyanovo-3 at Mednikarovo (opened 1969)

The coal mines supplies three thermal power plants (TPP) and one briquette factory –

- Maritza Iztok -1 TPP
- Maritza Iztok -2 TPP
- Maritza Iztok -3 TPP
